Finance Committee Report

July was not a good month financially. We finished the month with a deficit for July of \$4,895, which puts the year-to-date deficit at \$3,266 compared to a deficit of \$6,887 at the end of July in 2023. Expenses are below budget, but receipts are below budget as well, resulting in the deficit. The Finance Committee and Council will continue to monitor the financial status closely and review upcoming expenses for the remainder of the year.

September will be the start of the 2025 budget process. Budget requests will be prepared at the September 10 Round Table meeting, and the Finance Committee and Council will work to prepare a budget recommendation for the Congregation.


- One column is for setting up the processing area prior to the event from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.
